Meet Elham Dehbozorgi, chief ethics and risk counsel, Sterne, Kessler, Goldstein & Fox. Before Sterne Kessler, Dehbozorgi was a compliance and ethics attorney at Latham & Watkins and a conflicts attorney at WilmerHale.

If you could trade places with one person for a day, who would it be? NASA astronaut Scott Kelly. His photos from the space station are mindblowing. To be in his place for even a day and see the world from that perspective would be life-changing.

What's your best habit as a leader? Developing strong relationships with people across all levels of the firm. I'm able to mediate issues more effectively when my colleagues trust and respect me.

Biggest change in your industry: Like their corporate clients, law firms have developed in-house legal teams in recent years to protect their
