

Federal Circuit Affirms York County Prison District Court Win Finding Smart Communications' Mail Processing Patent Ineligible for Patenting

Sterne, Kessler, Goldstein & Fox secured a victory on behalf of York County Prison at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in a case involving a patent-infringement suit filed by Smart Communications against York County Prison. On August 18, 2023, the Federal Circuit affirmed a district court decision holding that Smart Communications' mail contraband-screening patent is ineligible for patenting because it merely uses conventional computing technology to accomplish a process for screening mail, which correctional facilities had been doing for over a century.
