Challenging the validity of a patent through the courts of Europe and the United States can be a time-consuming and expensive process. Oppositions at the European Patent Office (EPO) and

US post-grant cancellation proceedings—namely, post-grant review (PGR) and *inter partes* review (IPR)—adjudicated by the Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) – can be effective tools for dealing with competitors' patents.

It is often desirable to obtain patent protection for inventions both in Europe and the United States. As a result, competitors frequently look to Europe and the US as important jurisdictions for challenging the validity of a patent.

Patents can be challenged at the European Patent Office by opposition or at the US Patent and Trademark Office by post-grant proceedings such as *inter partes* review (IPR).
